MIC GIRLS BASKETBALL SEASON CONTINUES

Carmel won the opening MIC game of the year last week, defeating Terre Haute North 49-37. The Greyhounds were led by Torrie Thornton with 15 points and Blaire Langlois and Lucy DeFrusco with 14.

Warren Central remained unbeaten after defeating Arlington 73-23 and New Palestine 65-44. In the Arlington game Linzi Moore had 16 points, Taylor Ford 15 and BreAnn Denny 10 points. Against New Pal Brandi McKinney led the way with 13, and Moore and Taylor 12 each.

Top rated Ben Davis stayed perfect with wins over Pike 83-37 and Fort Wayne Elmhurst 72-38. Four Giants were in double figures against Pike led by Bria Goss with 15. Jordan Huber and Jazmine Windham each had 14 and Demetria Nunley-Lash

added 13. Brionna Arnold added 10 assists and 6 rebounds. Against Elmhurst Dee Dee Williams had 17 points and 9 rebounds, and Windham and Goss added 11 each.

Terre Haute South stayed unbeaten by stopping Northview 55-46. The Braves were led by Haley Seibert who had 23 points. Emily Bell added 10 points. The Braves also beat Rockville 51-33. Seibert was the only Brave in double figures with 19. Hannah Lee had 5 points and 10 rebounds.

Terre Haute North lost to Bloomington North 39-32 and lost their opening MIC game to Carmel 49-37. In the Bloomington North game Lindy Jones led the way with 15 points. Against Carmel Francesca McCarthy led all Patriot scorers with 13 points. Joining McCarthy in double figures was Nicole Anderson who scored 11 points.

Ben Davis won 10 of 12 events and beat Southport 123-60. Double winners for the Giants were Whitney Nielsen (200,100) and Dabney Gottman (IM, Fly). 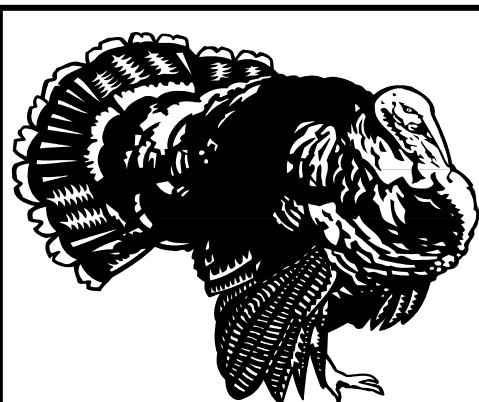
NEW MIC COACHES

CONFERENCE HI-LITES

Carmel, ranked #1 in the state football polls, and Warren Central, ranked #3 in the state football polls, will meet for the second time this season in the 5A State Championship game. Carmel will be making its fourth straight appearance in the title game, which ties a state record. When the streak began four years ago the Greyhounds also faced the Warriors.

Both Carmel and Warren Central will be playing for their 7th state football championship. Both head coaches, Mo Moriarty of Carmel and John Hart of Warren Central have won titles at other schools, Moriarty at Bloomington South and Hart at Evansville Reitz.

The title game matches the two schools that have won or tied for the MIC football championship the past six years.

The Greyhounds will travel to Lucas Oil Stadium for the championship game. It will be the 5th road game in the 6 week tournament for the Greyhounds, whose only home game was in the sectional final against Hamilton Southeastern.

The state title game will feature the passing of Carmel QB Adam Shaffer (1,532 yards-17 TD's) and rushing of Devin Brinson (1,151 yards) against the rushing of Warren Central TB Shakir Bell (2,848 yards-36 TD's). The Greyhounds are also the best defensive team in the MIC, allowing only 7.7 points per game, while the Warriors are the best offensive team averaging 35.7 points per game.

This will be the 11th consecutive year that a MIC team has played in the Class 5A championship game, and since two MIC teams are playing in the title game, it guarantees that a MIC team will be Class 5A state champion for the 9th straight year.

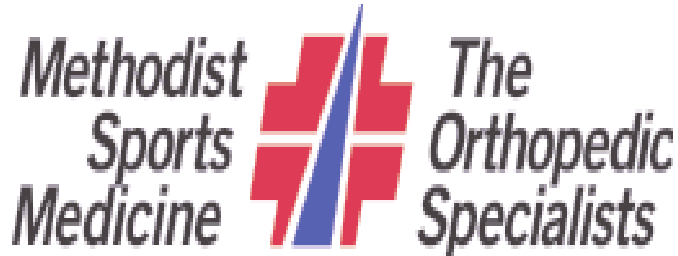
